	\$10 Billion Targeted Distribution for Safety Net Hospital Providers (Released week ending June 13)	To Be Determined	Recipients will receive a minimum distribution of \$5M and a maximum distribution of \$50M. Hospitals must meet all of the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A Medicare Disproportionate Payment Percentage of 20.2 percent or more; - An average uncompensated care per bed of \$25,000 or more; and - 3 percent or less profitability per the hospital’s most recently filed Cost Report to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

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	\$10 Billion Distribution for High Impact Areas (Future release; Using data submitted by hospitals)	To Be Determined	Additional “hot-spot” funding is available based on the number of COVID-19 positive inpatient admissions. Hospitals must submit the following data via HHS’ Teletracking portal by June 15: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Number of COVID-19 positive inpatient admissions from 1/1/2020 – 6/10/2020 (only COVID-19 positive inpatient admissions, not suspected).
	~\$15 Billion Distribution for Medicaid and CHIP Providers (Future release; Using data submitted by providers)	To Be Determined	Future release based on Medicaid/CHIP provider’s net revenue. Maryland hospitals are likely ineligible for this funding. Providers are eligible if they: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Did not receive payment from the previous \$50 billion General Distribution - Have directly billed their state Medicaid and CHIP programs or Medicaid managed care plans between Jan. 1, 2018 and May 31, 2020.
